GERMAN PRISONERS BEING SENT HOME

Have Been at Fort Henry for Some Time—Permanently Incapacitated.

Two German prisoners of war at Fort Henry are to be released shortly and returned to their fatherland. Orders to this effect have been received from Ottawa by Major Campbell, commandant of the fort. The reason for returning the men to Germany is that they are permanently incapacitated for military duty, both suffering from incurable diseases.

The men are Fred Rauchadt and Carl Grapengeisser, who were both taken in custody in Montreal, the former on November 5th, 1914, and the latter on January 17th, 1915.

This is thought to be the first case of German prisoners of war in Canadian internment camps being returned to Germany.
