

15 ALIEN ENEMIES - ARE SENTENCED FOR BREAKING PAROLE

It is not until lately that the local authorities have taken any action in regard to alien enemies, crossing the river and breaking parole. The law stated that they could not leave the country, but there was no penalty attached. When they went across the river they were locked up for a few days, but this did not do any good.

Chief Vincent at last wrote to Col. Sherwood, chief of the Dominion Police, pointing out the difficulty that the border towns have under the law. On Oct. 16 an order in council was passed imposing a penalty of from 3 to 6 months in prison for breaking any part of the regulations concerning alien enemies on parole. The result is that there have been about 15 sentenced from Oct. 28th up to the present.

An alien enemy cannot leave one town and go to another without first reporting to the local registrar. He must have his registration card with him at all times and show it when he is asked to do so.
