

# FAMILY INTERNED IN CANADA, GERMAN SOLDIER IS HAPPY

Captured Hun Delighted That His Wife and Children Escape the Conditions Prevailing in Germany.

London, Nov. 30.—"Though nothing spectacular is happening, don't imagine we are having a picnic," says a staff officer of Gen. Watson's fine division, which is still "somewhere on the Somme."

"Each night there are lively scraps. On Monday one of our little patrols found nearly fifty Huns up to some mischief not far from a recently-captured trench. Three men of

certain Highland battalion managed to get behind them with a Lewis gun and before Fritz reached home five had been killed and three captured.

"The Huns are still coming over and giving themselves up. Some of them complain bitterly of the treatment of their families at home in Germany. One fellow we grabbed was especially cheerful. His wife and children were interned in Canada, and he had a letter from them saying that they were well treated and happy, though lonely."
