The Kitchener Trouble. From the Hamilton Herald. The trouble would have been averted if a firm, consistent policy in the treatemnt of enemy aliens had been adopted and enforced early in the war. As it is, the enemy aliens in Kitchener have interpreted the good nature and leniency of the national authorities as a sign of weakness, and have abused the liberty accorded them, forgetting that they are aliens in a country of their country's enemies. Even now it may not be too late to repair the original mistake. Every alien in Kitchener who is known to have propagated pro-German

ideas ought to be promptly interned.
