

VETERANS APPROVE SUSPENSION TWO LETTER CARRIERS

Said to Have Been Active in Opposition to Signing of the Registration Cards

PUNISH SEDITIOUS

Brandon Association Calls on the Government to Deal Severely With Seditious

Strongly worded resolutions were passed at a well attended meeting of the Brandon branch of the Army and Navy Veterans' Association on Tuesday evening, commending the action of the Federal authorities in suspending letter carriers in Winnipeg pending an investigation into alleged anti-registration activities, and calling upon the Government to proceed against all persons making seditious utterances and that such persons be disfranchised.

A cordial reception was accorded Lieut. Milton Donaldson who recently returned wounded from the front. He stated that he hoped to be back on active service shortly and facetiously added that he hoped one day to qualify as a member of the Veterans' Association.

On the motion of Joe Field, seconded by Edward H. Winter, it was resolved: "That this meeting respectfully call upon the Dominion Government to proceed against all persons making seditious utterances and that said persons be disfranchised.

A further resolution on the motion of Albert Grant, seconded by A. G. Hall, was unanimously adopted as follows:

"That this meeting of the Brandon Branch of the Army and Navy Veterans' Association places upon record its hearty endorsement of the action of the Dominion Government in suspending the two Winnipeg letter carriers pending an inquiry into their alleged utterances opposing national service. We further beg to urge upon the Government that in the event of letter carriers or any other man being found guilty of using any language to hinder the government in the prosecution of the war, that such persons be forthwith interned as enemies of the empire and unfit to be allowed at large."
