

# TURK ENTERS CANADA WITHOUT HINDRANCE

## His Actions on Train for Hamilton Arouse Suspicion of Passengers

While travelling on the G. T. R. Detroit to Toronto train last night, a passenger, on glancing across the aisle, noticed a man, who bore all the resemblances possible to a Turk, leaning forward and looking with great interest at the entries an officer sitting in the seat ahead of him was making in a note book. The Turk, noticing he was observed, immediately sat back in his seat. The passenger knew Mr. J. E. Armstrong, M.P., who was also a passenger on the train, and the latter reported the matter to the conductor. When the train arrived at the Hamilton "Y" the man went to get off, but the conductor ordered him to his seat.

At Hamilton, after waiting a few minutes, the Turk slunk off the train. The officer followed him, and pointed him out to a policeman, who immediately went after him to gather him in.

It is said that the Turk boarded the train at Detroit for Hamilton, and passed the immigration inspector at Windsor.

Mr. Armstrong intends to investigate personally the matter at Ottawa.

## LETTER CARRIERS' OFFENCE SERIOUS

### MR. BENNETT REQUESTED THEIR SUSPENSION—INVESTIGATION WILL BE MADE.

Ottawa, Jan. 16.—Confirmation of the report that President W. Hoop of the Dominion Federation Letter Carriers, and Delegate Durnard have been suspended, was secured to-day at the Postoffice Department.

This action has been taken at the request of R. B. Bennett, M.P., Chairman of the National Service Commission, who charges that Hoop and Durnard advised people not to fill in the National Service cards. In view of the fact that they are public servants, and that it was their duty to distribute the cards, the Director-General of the National Service regards their offence as a serious one.

Announcement is made that an investigation into the charge made by Mr. Bennett will be made by an inspector of the Postoffice Department.

President Hoop is here to-day as a member of the Labor delegation which is waiting on the Government. It is understood that a separate Labor delegation will wait on the Government in regard to the charges against Hoop and Durnard.
