

WOULD JAIL FOES OF REGISTRATION

Brandon Army Veterans Ap- prove Suspension of 2 Win- nipeg Letter Carriers

BRANDON, Jan. 17 — Strongly worded resolutions were passed at a meeting of the Brandon branch of the Army and Navy Veterans' association Tuesday evening commending the action of the Federal authorities in suspending letter carriers in Winnipeg pending an investigation into alleged anti-registration activities, and calling upon the government to proceed against all persons making seditious utterances, and that such persons be disfranchised.

A cordial reception was accorded Lieut. Milton Donaldson, who recently returned wounded from the front. He said he hoped to be back on active service shortly, and facetiously added that he hoped one day to qualify as a member of the veterans' association.

On the motion of Joe Field, seconded by Edward H. Winter, it was resolved: "That this meeting respectfully call upon the Dominion government to proceed against all persons making seditious utterances, and that such persons be disfranchised.

A further resolution, on the motion of Albert Grant, seconded by A. G. Hall, was unanimously adopted as follows:

"That this meeting of the Brandon

branch of the Army and Navy Veterans' association places itself on record as heartily endorsing the action of the Dominion Government in suspending the two Winnipeg letter-carriers pending an inquiry into their alleged utterances opposing national service. We further beg to urge upon the government that in the event of the letter-carriers or any other person being found guilty of using any language that tends to hinder the due prosecution of the war, that such persons be forthwith interned as enemies of the empire and unfit to be allowed at large."
