

German Big Game Hunter Interned

Moose Jaw, Jan. 19.—William Weiss, German, and an employee of a local bank, has been apprehended by Constable Pass, of the local detachment of the R.N.W.M.P. and taken to the Banff internment camp by Constable Armstrong. The action is the result of an investigation about the first of the year by members of the R.N.W.M.P. when many letters from Germany were found in his room. These letters were sent to Regina for translation. Instructions were received by the local police to apprehend Weiss and escort him to the internment camp at Banff.

Weiss had been in the city about two months and had been transferred to this point from Vegreville, Alta. He was employed in the cash items department. It is said he had been in this country about four years and had formerly been employed in the "Reichstag Bank" in Berlin.

Came to Hunt Big Game

Weiss is said to have remarked that he came to Canada to hunt big game; and that he was prepared to do so resulted in his arrest previously at Vegreville, it is said, where he had his revolvers and shot-guns taken away from him.
