At Winnipeg the Czecks and Slovaks and Bohemians have been holding a celebration over the future of their respective countries forecasted in the Allied note to President Wilson. A recruiting sergeant might have gathered up quite a company on the occasion, if recruits from these races were acceptible. It is a peculiarity, and a disadvantage, that we have to treat as "alien enemies" people of a dozen or so races who come from enemy countries but who are passionately anxious to have the map of mid-Europe remade on the lines laid down by the Allies, and who would no doubt be willing enough to help do it if they were given the chance.
