## SAYS AUTHORITIES REFUSE TO ASSIST

President of Stone Works Avers
Appeal To Intelligence

Bureau Is Useless

William Bruce, president of the Manitobite Stone Works, stated Thursday night that aliens had control of Broad-Valley, north of Inwood, Man. His company has been unable to operate its quarries there for a year, he said. Local and Dominion military authorities have refused to act, he asserted.

Speaking to the shareholders at their annual meeting in their Kennedy building offices, he stated the directors had not dared make a tour of inspection. Company property had been destroyed, he said, and buildings burned.

His Frinch foreman was driven out a year ago, he stated, and the foreman's wife and children kidnapped. The man's home had been burned, and he did not know where

his family was.

Sworn statements had been given the local intelligence department, but they had not been considered, he declared. Similar affidavits sent to

Octawa produced no results.

Mr. Bruce intimated that the lack of action was due to the itude of the member of parliamen. for the district, who was rewarding his constituents for electing him by protecting them.

A claim for damages will be made to the Dominion government, Mr. Bruce said, as soon as the amount

of damage can be ascertained.
