No Complaints Among Aliens.—Interned diens have had no complaints to make as regards their treatment here, according to American Consul General F. M. Ryder, who stated yesterdix that upon relinquishing his supercision over these foreigners he would do so with the satisfiction of knowing that they had been well booked after by the Canadian authorties Mr. Ryder sud that he had made periodic trips to the camp at Brandon and had found everything In excellent condition on every occasion. He had made a careful examination of the food and had eaten meals there himself, so that he was convinced there were no justitiable complaints on that score.
