

FORT PRISONERS ARE GOING NORTH

Commandant Leaves Wednesday to Make Selection of Site for Camp.

Major H. E. Date, commandant of Fort Henry, leaves on Wednesday to make an inspection trip to northern Ontario to select a site to establish the new camp for the prisoners of war now at Fort Henry. There are camps at Spirit Lake, Kapuskasing, but it has not yet been decided as to where the new camp will be located or whether the prisoners will go into one of the existing camps.

In an interview granted the Whig on Tuesday the commandant stated that it had not yet been decided as to what troops would be used to guard the new camp. The 14th Regiment has supplied the guard to Fort Henry and the men are experienced and capable in their duties. There is a possibility of some at least of the officers and men going to the new camp, but until the major returns from his inspection trip and the condition learned, nothing can be decided.
