

## OPPOSES REMOVAL OF INTERNMENT CAMP

**Lt.-Col. Dale Thinks It Will  
Be Hard to Keep Prisoners  
Behind Wires.**

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Kingston, March 5.—Lieut.-Col. H. E. Dale, Commandant at Fort Henry, is opposed to the removal of the prisoners of war from Fort Henry to a camp in New Ontario. Internment of such men as those at the fort would be a difficult task, in view of their repeated attempts to escape while here. With a wire-enclosed camp in the northern woods it would be even more difficult to keep them in. However, all the prisoners will be out of the fort by March 15, and train arrangements are already being made.

### STRIKE RIOT AT FALLS.

**Police Fire Into 400 Strikers at Three  
United States Plants.**

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Niagara Falls, N.Y., March 5.—One man was fatally wounded to-night when police or private detectives fired upon a mob of 400 made up of strikers at three local plants and their sympathizers. Police Chief John Curry was struck on the head by a brick, and suffered severe lacerations, and two other policemen received scalp wounds in the fight.

The trouble began when strikers, it is alleged, attacked two workmen leaving the plant of the Acheson Graphite Company, one of the plants affected by the strike. Policemen arrested one of the strikers, and when they attempted to take him away in

the patrol waggon a mob which had gathered attacked the waggon. Shots were fired from the mob, the police say. A riot call was sent in, and about fifty policemen and private detectives were rushed to the scene.
