

# KEEPING TAB ON ALIENS

## Twenty-two Foreigners Rounded Up at Union

A party of 22 aliens from Sudbury, some of them natives of countries at war with the Allies, were rounded up at the Union Depot to-day and taken to the Registration Headquarters on Adelaide street east, where they were examined by Inspector Murray. The new arrivals, many of whom claimed to be Poles and Galicians, were on their way to employment at the Brass Works in New Toronto. Remarkably little business in the registration of aliens has been done this week, upwards of 200 having appeared before the Inspector since last Saturday.

The returned soldiers are making themselves responsible for the registration of foreigners to a great extent and during their recruiting campaign they have come in contact with many. Sergts. Blundell and Chadwick, two of the veterans interested in raising the new overseas company for the 109th, tackled two likely-looking eligibles to-day on the corner of Adelaide and Toronto streets, both of whom turned out to be Austrians. The sergeants, detecting the enemy tongue, made both men produce their registration cards before allowing them to proceed.

Every foreigner who fails to show his card is being taken in by the veterans these days and taken to headquarters for examination.
