

TO SEIZE WILSON AND INVADE CANADA

Gun Plotter Had Ambitious Plan —A Notorious International Crook.

NEW YORK, April 27.—Charges that Max Lynar, also known as "Count" Lynar-Loudon, had plotted to "seize the person of the President, and raise an army of 150,000 German reservists in this country for an invasion of Canada" were made yesterday when he applied for release on parole from the prison where he is serving a sentence for bigamy.

Application for the parole was made to Judge Rosalsky, in the court of General Sessions, through the commissioner of corrections, who recommended that it be granted. The application was opposed by representatives of the Department of Justice and the police.

During his trial, agents of the department of Justice made the allegation that Lynar was a notorious international crook, Max Schlemangk by name, who had operated in France and Germany prior to serving a prison term in Germany, under the alias of Count Marcel de Passy.
