whose knowledge of German law cannot be challenged, has no hesi-tation in saying that the Delbruck Act, passed in 1913, makes it impos-

sible for any German, from that date onwards, if not from that date backwards, to be loyal to any Crown or power or government, save that of Germany. Let any one read Mr. Balmer's translation of Dr. Barboza's interview and come to his own con-
