

One Motion Passed Two "Passed Up"

Mayor Drew Up Four, But
Only Two Were Needed.

Only two resolutions were passed by the conscription mass-meeting in Queen's Park on Saturday, though Mayor Church had taken the precaution to have four ready. The other two covered much the same ground, so it was decided to use only the first two. There was no effort to take a vote -- it was simply a storm of cheering, and the Mayor said: "Carried! Hurrah!"

Here are the four resolutions:

Carried.

1--"Resolved that this large mass-meeting of the citizens of Toronto places itself on record as in favor of the immediate enforcement of a policy of conscription by a "selective draft" by the Canadian Government.

"And that it should apply equally to all parts of the country, and that there should be a uniform enforcement of the Act, with nobody excluded.

2--"Resolved, that in the opinion of this meeting the Federal Government should take immediate steps to put down ~~sedition~~ in Canada, and immediately take steps to supply reinforcements by conscription, so that the divisions now at the front will have sufficient reinforcements.

Not Put.

3--"Resolved that this meeting call the attention of the Federal Government to the fact that certain sections of the country have not done their duty in this war in enlistments, and that a policy of conscription be adopted forthwith.

4--"Resolved, that in the opinion of this meeting conscription is the duty of the hour, to the exclusion of all other questions, and we hereby urge on the Government that such an Act be put into force forthwith."
