J. F. Tennant, of Veterans, Asserts 'Antis' Aid Aliens and Slackers

Anti-conscription agitators were denounced as traitors in the report of J. F. Tennant, director of publicity, at the weekly meeting of the Army and Navy Veterans in Canada, Thursday evening.

"Agitators of the Dixon, Rigg and Armstrong types," said Mr. Tennant, "are traitors. They exploit the cry for 'liberty in speech' for the ends of

aliens and slackers."

Lieut. W. A. Shepard told the assembled members that in a letter to the association. Premier Borden had promised to take up the question of alien industrial battalions before parliament.
