

# MAN GOES TO TRIAL ON SEDITION CHARGE

## A BUSY WEEK IN POLICE COURT.

The past week has been a very busy one in the local Police Court, and a large number of cases have been disposed of by Police Magistrate Stewart. Fred Mohns, of Petawawa, whose preliminary hearing on a charge of giving expression to seditious utterances was twice adjourned, came up yesterday and on the evidence produced by the Crown the Magistrate committed him to stand his trial at the next sitting of High Court, which will be held in December. Thus there will be two cases of "sedition" for that court. Those who gave evidence at yesterday's hearing were Mrs Roberts, of Petawawa, Miss McKay, of Cobden, teacher at Petawawa, Miss Charette and Albert Biesenthal, of that township. Mr W. H. Williams, K.C., defended Mohns, and Mr J. H. Burritt, K.C., Crown Attorney, prosecuted. Mohns was given his liberty on \$2,000 bail.
