## THANKS, YOUR HONOR

Mr. Justice Metcalfe has refused the application by Attorney M. N. Doyle for a writ of Habeas Corpus to be

used in freeing two Austrians sentenced last week by a military court

to two months in jail. The Austrians were two of the twenty-six to whom

different sentences were meted out

for the trouble at Transcona. It was argued by the attorney for the Austrians that Major Heath Jackson,

by whom the men were sentenced to prison, had exceeded his authority

and had construed the law too narrowly. Justice Metcalfe decided that the

Austrians had broken their parole by leaving Winnipeg in addition to the offence of creating disorders in Transcona. In making his pronouncement

on the application, he said: "The law, applying to alien enemies, their duties and limits in war time, cannot be too narrowly construed at this stage of

hostilities." Police Magistrate Fraser might well paste that sentence in his hat, or better still, in some place where he will

have it ever before him.
