Council Will Ask to be Reimbursed

by Dominion Authorities.

The question of the jitneys was again introduced into the business of the city council at last night's meeting, when a communication was re-

ceived from the Winnipeg Trades and Labor council strongly urging that adequate bonds be required from

that adequate bonds be required from the jitney service as a means of affording the public protection in case of accidents. The matter was referred to the market, license and re-

lief committee.

The city solicitor, on motion of Ald.
Simpson, seconded by Controller Put-

tee, was instructed to immediately take up with the department of alien enemies the question of reimbursement to the city for relief being administered by the Social Welfare

commission to the destitute families of aliens sentenced on July 21 by Major Jackson, under the War Measures act, relating to enemy aliens.

Ald. Simpson, in speaking to his motion, stated that 11 families, with an aggregate of 23 persons, have been looked after by the commission, and
