age a felony, was introduced today by Senator Myers and referred to the Judiciary committee. The measure

would penalize utterance of any "disloyal, scurrilous, contemptuous, slurring, abusive or seditious language" about the government, constitution, president, army, navy or fiag. or the utterance of any other language calculated to bring the government or the president into contempt or scorn or which might incite resistance to state or national authority. with a fine or from \$500 to \$5,000 and imprisonment of from six months

to five years.
