

CAMPERS ANNOYED BY MEN WHO HUNG AROUND COTTAGES

Austrian Was Fined By Magistrate for Riding on Sidewalk

Police court fines ran high yesterday, but those fined paid nevertheless.

Fred Probyjbaba, an Austrian was charged with deliberately riding up and down the sidewalk, on a bicycle, or which offence he was ordered to pay a fine of \$20 and costs or spend 21 days in jail.

John Zatchy, another Austrian, occupied his time in trying to force his attentions on a young lady in a downtown store by following her around on the streets on her way home, there by making himself objectionable. Last night he followed the young lady up Bruce street and hung around her home for some time. The police were called and in court a fine of \$100 and costs, or six months in jail as an alternative, was imposed. He paid the fine.

Giuseppe Fulfara and Michael Rasso, two Italians have been making themselves objectionable by hanging around the summer cottages along the river front on Queen street east for several days, so much so, that some of the ladies were frightened at their presence. Yesterday the police were called by Mr. Jack Ross, who is camping along the river front, to move the men from around his cottage, and Sergt. Johnston and Constable McCauley, went down in an automobile to gather them in. Fulfaro started a scrap and bit Constable McCauley's hand in the mix up.

Both men were fined \$100 and costs for loitering around the roads, and for obstructing the policeman. Fulfaro was fined an additional \$200 and costs with the alternative of spending six months in jail.

Frank Gilbert, 112 Gore street, was found guilty in court yesterday of selling cigarettes to a boy under 16 years of age and was fined \$10 and costs.
