

PEACE DISTURBERS

BARRED FROM CANADA

Dominion Immigration Authorities Will Keep Disturb-ers From Border.

Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 6.—The Dominion's immigration officials have succeeded in their fight to keep I. W. W. agitators south of the international border.

J. Bruce Walker, Commissioner of Immigration, stated to-day that since the arrest and conviction of the first six men who made their way into Western harvest fields there has been no trouble. Constant vigilance on the part of the border officials has made it impossible for others to get into the country, although many have tried.

Govt. Commences Investigation.

Washington, Sept. 6.—The Government proposes to eliminate I. W. W. and other anti-American activity from the nation's political and commercial structure.

To this end Government investigators throughout the country to-day examined the I. W. W. and Socialist documents gleaned in yesterday's sweep on many headquarters.

Evidence already in the Department of Justice shows that the I. W. W. activities have embarrassed industries, particularly the Western mines, producing war material. This evidence shows, too, that the I. W. W. proposed to spread its doctrines of violence all over the land.

The patriotic education society to-day charged directly that Austrians and Bulgars are responsible for these disorders, acting for the German secret service. The extent of I. W. W. plans is indicated by the openly expressed fear that they might try to capture the Minneapolis session of the American Alliance for Labor and Democracy and distort its deliberations into I. W. W. propaganda.
