MANAGER SAYS NONE

Eight Men and One Woman

HAVE BEEN IMPORTED

Associated Press by Leased Wire. MONTREAL, Sept. 27.—Charged

with a violation of the Alien Labor Law, eight men and one woman, all

Americans, appeared before Judge St. Cyr this morning in connection with the strike of the Great North

Western company operators.

They pleaded not guilty, were re-

allowed out on \$100 bail.

The men gave their names and ad-

dresses as follows:—A. J. Davis, Brooklyn, N.K.; J. E. Noseworthy, New York City; N. D. Sojomon, New

L. F. Clure, New Orleans; J. J. Histner, New York; E. V. Cooney, New York, and A. F. Dann, New York.

The woman detained is Miss A. J. Knuff, and is believed to come from New York. She fainted last night when notified of the charge that

would be laid against her.

The local police are still searching for three more men. The telegraphers' union officials allege that the

men and women were sent to Montreal to act as strike-breakers.
