

WINNIPEG INSURANCE MAN TRIED FOR SEDITION

Winnipeg, Oct. 3—The case of Alderic Cardin, the insurance agent, who is charged with making seditious statements, was continued in the Provincial Police Court Tuesday.

Jas. McMillan, a hardware traveller, in giving evidence for the crown, swore that Cardin made a number of decidedly pro-German statements to him. Evidence of Thomas Murray, a farmer near Grahamville, Man., went to show that Cardin had tried to discourage Murray from enlisting by telling him that the English kept their soldiers at home and sent Canadians and other colonial troops to the front line trenches. Murray also said that Cardin had told him that the Germans were intelligent people and they were sure to win the war. When examined by Magistrate Noble, Murray stated that he had thought Cardin was a spy in pay of the Germans and that he was travelling as an insurance agent just to protect himself from being caught.
