

KALLZCHMIDT TRIAL ON TODAY

Detroit, Dec. 4.—Two convicts from the Kingston penitentiary are to be the principal witnesses for the Government at the trial which begins in the Federal court here today of Albert Katzschmidt and several others in charges of conspiring to dynamite numerous Canadian factories. They are Charles F. Respa and William Leffler, convicted of dynamiting the plant of the Overall Company, Ltd., Walkerville, in June 1915. Respa is under sentence of life imprisonment and Leffler was sentenced for ten years. According to the Canadian authorities Leffler in a confession charged that Kaltschmidt, who has lived in Detroit for a number of years, was the instigator of a far reaching dynamite conspiracy. Respa's father, Frank Respa, 70 years old, is one of those to be tried with Kaltschmidt.
