## FIRE DESTROYS **BIG IRON WORKS**

Toronto Plant Where Aliens Were Employed is Razed by Mysterious Fire-Damage is \$250,000.

TORONTO, Dec. 7 .- Fire which originated in the pattern shop of the Polson Iron Works, on the Toronto waterfront, at 6:15 o'clock last night completely destroyed this building, a number of smaller sheds and badly damaged a large freighter and trawler, the total damage being estimated by the president of the concern, Col. J. B. Miller, at about \$250,-000 or \$300,000. The loss is covered by insurance.

How the fire occurred is a mystery, but a significant statement was made by Wm. Newman, the manager, when asked about the number of aliens employed at the plant and whether they might be responsible.
"I don't know," he replied, "but
