Detroit, Dec. 12. — Photopraphic copies of letters and checks which bore the finame of prominent German officials and agents were introduced in the United States District Court by the government at the conspiracy trial of Albert C. Kaltschmidt of De troit and five atleged accomplices.

One of the principal bits of evidence was a photograph of a letter authorizing the transfer of \$25,000 to Kaltschmidt's account. The order was drawn on the joint account of County on Bernstoff, German ambassador.
