

ROUNDING UP

ALIEN ENEMIES

Windsor Police Gather in Fifteen Austrians—Search Will be Continued

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Windsor, Dec. 19. — Shortly before midnight to-night the Windsor police started a round-up of alien enemies who have failed to comply with the order in Council requiring that they register, and also report monthly to the authorities.

The search included practically all the "foreign quarters" of Tuscarora street, Marion avenue and Parent avenue, and when the dragnet was pulled in it held fifteen Austrians. The men were lined up in Wyandotte street by the officers, and when it was found none carried firearms, all were marched to the Police Station at the City Hall and locked up for the night.

It is estimated that there are close to 200 alien enemies in Windsor, principally Austrians, and the search will be continued until all have been accounted for. A number will undoubtedly be interned until after the war.

Heavy fines have been repeatedly imposed on members of the foreign colony at various times for breaches of statutes, but this appearing to have no lasting effect, the authorities determined upon more drastic methods.

POSED AS SERGEANT, WOUNDED, DECORATED

PRETENDED "SGT. WILLIAMS" IS ARRESTED—CONFESSES TO THEFT.

Montreal, Dec. 19.—A man who posed as Sergeant Williams of the 48th Ammunition Column of Winnipeg, and who wore the uniform of a Sergeant, with decorations to show that he had been twice wounded, also several decorations such as are bestowed for bravery on the field of battle, was arrested at the Chateau Laurier, Ottawa, yesterday, by Chief Moffatt of Westmount, who had followed the supposed soldier there from this city for the purpose of taking him into custody on charges of theft and personating a soldier. "Sergt. Williams" had spent a couple of enjoyable weeks in this city and Westmount, where he was royally entertained by society people. He left here for Ottawa last Saturday and was brought back yesterday.

Williams pleaded guilty to stealing clothing from a boarding-house on Sherbrooke street, and also to having impersonated a non-commissioned officer. He will be sentenced on Friday.
