

SAYS WINDSOR WOMAN HELPS ENEMY ALIENS

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Windsor, Feb. 25. — Orval G. Adams, officer in charge of the Canadian Immigration Department at Windsor, has been asked by the military authorities of Military District No. 1, at London, to investigate a statement made by Jesse Whitnell Hoffman, who was arrested here on a charge of being a draft evader and an unregistered alien enemy, that a Windsor society woman had been assisting alien enemies to leave the Dominion.

Hoffman, who is considered a "mystery man" by the military authorities, is being held at London for further investigation.

WASHOUT ON G. T. R.
