

VETERANS INTERVIEW FEDERAL MINISTERS

LATTER SEE DIFFICULTY IN
CONSCRIPTION OF ENEMY
ALIENS FOR LABOR.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Ottawa, March 26.—All the Provincial organizations of the Great War Veterans' Association were represented in a deputation which conferred with members of the Government to-day. The Veterans discussed with the Ministers proposals that alien enemies in the country be conscripted for essential industries, problems connected with the administration of the soldiers' land settlement legislation, and the vocational training of men undergoing treatment in military hospitals. The Ministers, it is understood, pointed out the difficulties in the way of conscripting alien enemies, but expressed a hope that some satisfactory solution of the labor situation would be reached.

At the conference were Sir Robert Borden, Hon. S. C. Mewburn (Minister of Militia), Hon. Arthur Meighen, Hon. T. A. Crerar, Hon. J. A. Calder, and Senator McLennan, representing Sir James Lougheed, Minister of the Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment. The Veterans were headed by J. F. Knight, the Dominion Secretary of their organization.
