Corpus Law Is Suspended. (Canadia: Press Despatch) Ottawa, April 6.—The Order-in-Council dealing with there was laid on the table of the House of Com-

mons yesterday afternoon by Sir Robert Borden. The order provides that every male pe son residing in Canada betwee: the ages of sixteen and sixty must be regularly employed in some useful occupation. Excep-

tion is made for students, men temporarily unemployed owing to differences with their employers, those physically unfit and those unable to obtain work within a reasonable distance. There is a penalty of one

hundred dollars and costs or imprisonment with hard labor for six months
