War Veterans Think Time Has Come for Action. WINNIPEG, May 16.—With the se-

passed was one to confiscate land held by aliens within the Dominion, such land to be sold by auction for the ben-

efit of war purposes. Following a hotly contested fight at the morning session, Winnipeg beat out Ottawa in the race to secure the

Dominion headquarters of the Army and Navy Veterans' Association of Canada.

R. C. Irving of Winnipeg was selected Dominion secretary; Rev. Dr. J. B. Solcox, Winnipeg, was appointed chap-

lain, and Ed. Low, treasurer. Representatives on the executive were appointed as follows. British Columbia, E. A. Pooley, Vancouver,

Prince Edward Island will be the president of the Charlottetown branch.
