Army and Navy Veterans Select April As Month For Annual Meeting

A resolution urging the Dominion government to confiscate all lands held by enemy aliens was discussed and turned over to the executive for further action, with the understanding that every branch of the association would forward resolutions to Premier Borden urging this move.
