

FURTHER ARREST IN ALLEGED CONSPIRACY

Andrew Bobanks Said to Have
Written of "Bloody Mili-
tarism of Canada."

Windsor, Ont., July 6.—In the arrest of Andrew Bobanko, age 26, alleged co-conspirator of John Perehuda, who was committed for trial on charges of sedition, the police believe they have uncovered a continent-wide plot to overthrow lawful authority and establish a similar regime to that instituted in Russia by Trotzky and Lenine.

Arraigned in Police Court yesterday Bobanko professed not to understand English when the Government interpreter translated letters written by the accused to organizations of "Union of Russian Workmen" in Montreal and other Canadian cities. In these letters local authorities were termed "parasites," while members of the union were urged to keep up the fight against the "bloody militarism of Canada." "Yours for anarchism and communism," he wrote under his signature as secretary of the organization
