the Victory Loan, and in general,
have been faithful to the traditionsof their native country by supporting the Liberal Government of Venizelos of Greece, an ally of Great Britain, conscious of what England has
done and is doing for the existence
of Greece and how great their graticulded populace under the influence
of false reports, spread, very probably, by Bulgarian propagandists. We
