The evidence already secured by the authorities was considered to be of such a serious nature that bal' was refused when he came before Magistrate Elliot this morning.

'Mr. Urlah McFadden, who is ap-

pearing for the defendant, asked the Crown to name the amount of ball that would be acceptable, as there were a large number of Enchuk's friends who were willing to put up

bail for him. But on the advice of the crown attorney the magistrate refused to accept bail. The preliminary hearing was adjourned till September 5.

Seven Italians were fined \$2 and costs this morning for refusing to pay their poll tax when asked.
