

GENERAL STRIKE SEEMS IMMINENT

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Vancouver, Sept. 19.—Unless the demands of the miners in the Fernie district for a shift of eight hours is granted, or the operators consent to meet the men and discuss their request, a general strike, involving 9,000 men, and including the coal mining sections of all eastern British Columbia and part of Alberta, will be declared, representatives of the miners now in Vancouver stated today.

Teutons Urged to Accept Allied Peace Conditions

Amsterdam, Sept. 19.—Count Michael Karolyi, the Hungarian Opposition Leader, has reiterated his declaration that the Central powers should accept President Wilson's fourteen peace points as the basis for peace negotiations, according to a Budapest despatch to The Frankfort Gazette. Another essential, he says, is for "serious democratic Governments" in Austria-Hungary and Germany to take the helm. The reactionaries, he insists, must be sent to the rear. The situation, he adds, also calls for the abrogation of the

Brest-Litovsk and Bucharest peace treaties.

"Thus only can peace come," the Count declares.
