EDITOR WILL BE TRIED ON CHARGE OF SEDITION

Michael Charinoff, Suite 4, 567 Selkirk ave., editor of the Russian paper,
"The Working People," will face a
charge of sedition in city police
court Friday. It is alleged by the
police that Charinoff has been circulating enemy propaganda and collecting money for anti-Ally purposes.
He is a Russian with Bolshevik sympathies.

One of the pamphlets he is charged with distributing makes the statement that "England did not enter the

war to help Belgium, but to better her territorial position."

Police raided Charinoff's house Monday. They found copies of "The Working People" containing alleged seditious statements, pamphlets written by Lenine, the Russian premier, and correspondence between Charinoff and a man in Sudberry, Ont., who was found guilty on the same count some time ago.

Police heard of the paper through its saie at the People's book store.

Charinoff appeared in court today. He was let out on bail of two sureties of \$500 each.
