Those present included Chancellor Bonar Law, Lord Curzon, Austen Chamberlain, Gen. Sir Louis Botha, Lieut-Gen. Smuts, Sir Joseph Cook, Sir Robert Borden, the Maharajah of Bikanir, and Sir S. P. Sinha.

FOREIGNERS HEAVILY FINED.
