To Bring Pressure on Government for Mother's Pensions

National Council of Women Favors
Deportation of Interned
Aliens

KINGSTON, Ont., Jan. 13—The National Council of Women, having for several years advocated government action in favor of mothers' pensions, it was felt that extra pressure should be brought to bear at the present moment, when the matter is under serious consideration and the following resolution was passed Saturday:

Resolved, that the National Coun-

cil of Women of Canada, in executive assembly, once more affirms its belief in the principle of mothers' allowances, and xpresses the hope that in the near future all those provincial legislatures, where allowances have not yet been adopted, may at once enact the legislation necessary to being such allowances into effect.

The resolution was passed, after comparatively little discussion. With reference to the deportation of alien enemies, it was resolved that, in the opinion of the National Council of Women of Canada, all alien enemies and families interned in Canada shou'd immediately, upon their release or discharge from such internment, be taken in charge by proper and competent authority, and deported, each to his own country.
