COMMISSION TO REGISTER ENEMY ALIENS APPOINTED

Belated But Important Work Be= gins in Manitoba.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 8 .- Official announce-

ment of the commission to conduct the registration of aliens of enemy nationality in Manitoba was made in the legislature this afternoon by Premier Norris, who stated that Judge R. H. Myers of the county court had accepted the position of chairman. The commission, which will start work on Monday, will consist of two other members, one selected by the returned soldiers and the other by the Trades and Labor Council. A. E. Moore has been named by the soldiers. The representative of labor will, it is expected, be selected by the council at its meeting on Tuesday night.
