ALIEN INVESTIGATION BOARD TO SIT FIRST TIME FRIDAY MORNING

Aliens wishing to prove their loyalty to this country and their consequent right to remain here and be employed will have a chance to obtain official credentials Friday morning at 10 o'clock when the Alien Investigation board starts operations at 185 Lombard st.

The board comprises Judge R. Hill Myers, senior county court judge; A. E. Moore, of the Great War Veterans' association; and R. Sutherland, representing labor.

The plan of procedure adopted will involve personal application of the alien for credentials. It will be accepted hereafter that aliens having no credentials are not entitled to them and accordingly a great rush of business is expected as soon as the bureau opens.

The applicant will be expected to satisfy the board that he is loyal to Canada, and his statements must be corroborated by at least two reputable persons by whom he is well known. On proving his loyalty the applicant will be given a signed credential which will be a sign manual of his right to live and work in Manitoba.
