characterized by a subtle campaign of impression, comprising every tricky meanness known to the German soul. It took the soldier of Canada three years to learn to look with suspicion on everything spoken, written or conveyed in any way that even seemed in the remotest degree favorable to the enemy or derogatory to his own cause. Throughout the war Germany pursued the policy, by snaky methods, of creating discontent among the Allies and doubts in the hearts of the fighters themselves. The results of this subtle campaign were appalling. Russia is a glaring example of the business. On his return to Canada, the fighting man has suddenly become aware of the same influence at work. He sees himself menaced in many ways by subtle inuendo, by direct accusation, by attempts to create difficulties between himself and organized labor, and by attempts to create discontent in his own ranks.

THIS IS PROPAGANDA.

This propaganda is due to several causes. First and foremost we have the enemy in our midst. Germany beaten on the field of battle is far from beaten in the field of commerce. The more discord she can create the better for her business prospects. Then we have the Bolshevik. He is always trying to create discontent in order to break down the barrier between the returned man and his own organization, and, at a certain type of personal campaign to create rebellion, he is adept. Then we have the political grafter who wants discontent in order to get in on the remedy of it, to his own profit, in other words the "issue hunter." Then we have the land shark, who hates like the mischief to see things smoothing out for the returned man on

SOLDIER'S TENETS.

His Ambition After Four Years of War Set Forth in Few Words.

The man who served his country can express his ambition in few words.

He seeks to upbuild, not to destroy. He wants to live, laugh, learn and love.

He wants to make room for the light to fall so that the other fellow can see his way.

He wants truth and beauty in friendship and society. He wants to absorb and teach, and to radiate tolerance, gentleness and brotherhood.

He wants to see isles and continents under the rule of Utopia and to hear blown on the erstwhile bugles of war the peace calls of all nations.

He wants to see come out of the seething processes of growth the crowning strain of man, clean as in the blush of primeval dawn. He wants distance annihilated and time subdued, and the divine principle filtering through existence. He wants love of love for love's own sake, and having shown the greatest love he knows this possible.

the land without yielding to him the pound of flesh, and last but not least we have the "goose-flesh" capitalist, happily few in Canada but nevertheless here. This good person foresees dire ruin staring him in the face if the returned soldier gets anything. He fears that the soldier's ambition for social justice—not anarchy or Bolshevism—merely social justice and equal opportunity, will smash up the country and end prosperity. The object of most of it is disruption of the comradeship happily existing among returned men and weakening their combined strength.

The methods adopted vary. We have seen specimens of the newspaper campaign. The samples recently are a story in a Montreal paper to the effect that an institution there had established a "cooler" to get drunken returned men in condition to return home to their families, similar to the "hundreds of thousands" of sad Canadian homes story in an Ottawa newspaper. We have had two Toronto newspapers attacking without cause several of the most high minded men in the returned men's organizations. We have had a Hamilton paper deploring our terrible tendency to take the law into our own hands. We have had a Winnipeg newspaper misrepresenting the riots there as due to lawlessness on the part of the returned man, instead of coming out with the truth that the employers of alien enemies had been warned that these aliens must make way for Canadian soldiers, or they would have to take the consequences. In short, the soldiers enforced obedience to the law of the land. Other examples would fill columns.

We purpose, wherever it stalks, lifting the veil from the features of this pestilential ghost of unrest. We assert that all the attacks leveled at the returned men in certain sections of the press in Canada are propaganda. We assert that attempts to sow discord between organized labor and the returned man by trying to foist diluted labor on the unions on the grounds that the labor is "returned soldier labor" is propaganda. We assert that the dissension recently seen—but only, we may thankfully say, to a small extent—in certain circles of the G. W. V. A. is propaganda. We assert that criticism of the returned man's measures for the welfare of his comrades is propaganda. Therefore, we say to our comrades: When

ever rumor says to you that your lot is terrible: Swat it. Whenever you see a newspaper attacking you, either by innuendo or directly, put it down to propaganda and: Swat it. Whenever you find any organization, temperance, church, liquor interests or anything else, either commiserating with you or condemning you with faint praise: Swat it. Be as suspicious now as you were in war of anything written, said or conveyed unless you know the direct source and the cause.
