TO REGISTER MEN

Delegation Receives Permission of Enemy Alien Board For This Work

The Ukrainian Canadian Citizens' league will handle the registration of Ukrainians in Manitoba. The request of a delegation of league officials was granted by Judge Myers, of the alien enemy board, at 185 Lombard st., today. Five hundred blank interrogatories will be forwarded to the Ukrainians' headquarters, at 586 Burrows ave., where they will be filled out. Ukrainians will take the oath at the office of the alien enemy board, and receive cards there.

The delegation was headed by J. D. Arsenych and included T. D. Ferley, provincial member for Gimli, O. H. Hykaway and Joseph Boyawsky. It is estimated that there are more than 5,000 men of Ukrainian birth in Winnipeg.

H. J. Mansfield, secretary of the board, announced today that between 200 and 300 interrogatories had been filled out. The alien enemy has granted cards to 26 men and has withheld two.

Following are cases heard by the board at today's session:

Waszl Chonz, Ukrainian, 141 Mead st., told the board he had come from Ninette to Winnipeg two weeks ago and could not get work. He had been in Canada 11 years but could not produce naturalization papers. A wife and two children are in Ukraine. The man was unable to obtain references from English speaking citizens, but claimed to be loyal to Canada. The case is being considered.

William Wasyluk was told to return in one week when he pleaded loyalty. He informed Judge Myers that he had been interned 10 months at Kapuskasing, Ont., because he could not get work. He was released six months ago, he said.
