

LICENSES TO ALIENS.

Winnipeg Veterans to go to Council— Ukrainian Bank Movement.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Winnipeg, March 27.—At a meeting of the Great War Veterans' Association Executive a delegation was appointed to go before the City Council with regard to the alleged indiscriminate granting of licenses to undesirable aliens.

A resolution was passed directing the Federal Government's attention to an attempt now being made by Bishop Budka and his disciples to obtain a charter for incorporating an Ukrainian Bank in Western Canada; and it was further resolved that all Germans and Austrians, particularly the clergy, be debarred by Federal authorities from entering Canada for twenty years.

MAGDALEN ISLANDS MAIL

Quebec, March 27.—The first delivery of mail to the Magdalen Islands for some time will be made this month. Notification was received here to-day by the Postoffice authorities that the Canadian Government Steamer Stanley will sail for the Islands from Halifax on Saturday morning, the 29th instant.
