

LAIM FOREIGNER STOLE ANOTHER'S BANK SAVINGS

SUDBURY, April 16.—A. Lupul, foreigner arrested here on instructions from Montreal police, is charged with the theft of a Post Office Savings Bank book from a fellow-Austrian, whom it is alleged he successfully impersonated and secured thirteen hundred dollars from the department. When arrested he had \$1,427.24 in a belt around his waist. The prisoner was located through information available in alien enemy registration records. He has been taken to Montreal for trial.

The building occupied by the Sudbury Journal, which ceased publication during the war, for over 25 years, is being torn down this week to make room for a new branch bank of the Bank of Commerce.
