Samsonavitch was a student of Columbia University, who was expelled for seditious utterances, who attempted to enter Torontto University after coming to Canada. He was turned down as an undesirable, but on several dates addressed socialist cathering in Broadway Hall.

Ewart is a native Germing to his papers, who came to take ada in 1914. The woman Zaborowski was also a German and she went with Ewart as her husband.

Literature which was seized showed Boisheviki propaganda has penetrated the Toronto branches of the Communist Party, the International Workers, the General Workers and the Revolutionary and
