ARCHBISHOP BUDKA RETURNS TO CITY; WANTS IMMEDIATE PROBE INTO CITIZENSHIP

Archbishop Budka, primate of all Canada in the Ruthenian Greek Catholic church, returned today after sev-

eral days' absence in Saskatchewan. He said he had come back to face cer-

tain charges which, he understood,

"I am desirous of the most search-

ing investigation into my loyalty, my citizenship and my writings during the last five years." he told The Tribune. "I also desire that such in-

vestigation shall be in public and that an opportunity shall be given all to attend who have any complaints to make against me. I am satisfied that such an investigation will cause the

Great War Veterans to look upon me as a good Canadian citizen.

T. J. Murray, barrister, has been retained by Archbishop Budka to do all possible to arrange for the speedy holding of the proposed investigation

and has instructed him to give the investigation board all possible aid.

Officials of the Alien Enemy Investigation board are busy today gathering further evidence which will be

presented at the investigation to be held next week into the loyalty and general conduct of Archbishop Budka.
